

**ARC Investment Partners Participates
At Second Annual Clinton Global Initiative Conference**

***--Guests of Private Equity Firm Make Commitments
In Global Healthcare and Climate Change/Renewable Energies--***

New York, NY, September 20, 2006—Adam Roseman, CEO of ARC Investment Partners, a Beverly Hills-based private equity firm, and seven guests were among 1,000 invited attendees from around the world to participate in the second annual, invitation-only Clinton Global Initiative (CGI), held in parallel with the United Nations General Assembly.

CGI brought together heads of states, Fortune 100 CEOs, world leaders and others, who generated more than \$7.3 billion of commitments in four critical areas of focus: religious reconciliation, extreme poverty eradication, global healthcare in developing nations and climate change / renewable energies. Richard Branson made the largest individual commitment, \$3 billion, to renewable fuels.

Invited as “emerging leaders,” Mr. Roseman and his group were provided with the opportunity to network with, and learn from, notable attendees, including Bill Gates, Warren Buffett, former President Bill and Senator Hillary Clinton, First Lady Laura Bush, King Abdullah, Queen Rania Al-Abdullah, President Pervez Musharraf, Archbishop Desmond TuTu, John Chambers, H. Lee Scott, former Vice President Al Gore, Sir Richard Branson, Secretary of State Colin Powell, the Reverend Jesse Jackson, Barbara Streisand, Tom Brokaw, former Israeli Premier Shimon Peres, U.N. Secretary General Kofi Annan and others.

Mr. Roseman and each of his guests made commitments to global healthcare and climate change / renewable energies. ARC Investment Partners is focused heavily on businesses within the renewable and clean energies sector.

ARC Investment Partners last year established the ARC Foundation to fund charitable organizations supported by its founder and senior executives. It sets aside 5% of the total equity allocated to the firm and its employees on each transaction for distribution to various charitable organizations. In addition to CGI, the ARC Foundation has supported Habitat for Humanity, Cedars-Sinai Medical Center, Race to Erase MS, EMQ Children’s and Family Service, and Big Brothers, Big Sisters of Greater Los Angeles, the Inland Empire and Orange County.
